## Compensation and Requirements

All participants will receive \$100 per day stipend for the four day summer workshop. In addition, participants must choose from one of the three options below:

### Option One:

Receive 4 Hours of Professional Development Credit:

1. Attend the four day summer workshop as outlined in the *Workshop Agenda*.
  2. Post Workshop: Implement tangible learning product(s) in the form of inquiry or hands-on lessons/activities using CORMP resources. This includes, but is not limited to using real-time and archived CORMP data available on our website to lessons or activities; make use of "CORMP in a Box" research materials for the classroom; incorporating the web-based OceanView, RiverView or New River Data Visualization Tools (DVT's) into classroom learning; using and improving lesson plans and activities currently included on the CORMP Teacher and Students Resources Page. Write a 2-3 page account that outlines the product developed above. Allow CORMP staff and/or Dr. Rich Huber of the Watson School of Education to observe implementation of these products in your classroom. Teachers will be required to keep a log of their time adding up to approximately 28 hours.
  3. Finally, return to UNCW for a seminar in December 2005 where participants share products developed with other Summer Workshop participants.
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### Option Two:

Receive 2 Graduate Credits to be used towards an advanced degree at UNCW:

1. Enroll in a directed independent study course (DIS) course with Dr. Rich Huber (Watson School of Education) in Summer 2005. Participants are responsible for all costs associated with enrollment, fees, and other university charges.
  2. Follow the steps outlined in Option Two.
  3. After satisfactory completion of all requirements you will be credited with two graduate credits and be given a grade from UNCW.
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### Option Three:

Receive 3 Hours of Professional Development Credit:

1. Attend the four day summer workshop as outlined in the *Workshop Agenda*.
